Power of Prayer

Prayer is powerful! God is always listening and helps heal the broken. At Christian Clearing House (CCH) there is a prayer board hanging on the wall. This is an easy way for those facing difficult or emergency crisis to ask for prayer. Staff, volunteers, churches and other read the board to extend prayer for the requests. Volunteers interviewing with clients often hear the heart wrenching stories (sometimes very difficult to listen to). They too add prayers to the board for those with extreme needs.

Those entering the CCH office come from all backgrounds and have many differet needs. Some are homeless, some are single parents working in low paying job, some are facing a serious medical condition and are unable to work, whatever the situation, the client is treated with kindness and respect. Often those working, struggle because they have just enough money to make ends meet. When something happen (such as a car repair or a child being ill — causing them to miss work) it can send them into a downward financial spiral, making their world seem as if it is caving in.

The prayer board shows the depth of those facing crisis especially medical diagnoses. Here are just a few of the stories that the prayer board revealed:

Margaret was recently diagnosed with a cancerous growth on her optic nerve. Her doctor was located Columbus. Time was of the essence (in order to save her sight). CCH was able to

provide a gas voucher to get Margaret to the appointment.

Shelly's daughter, Hatley (age 2) was having difficulty breathing over the warm Memorial Day weekend. Hatley was recently diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis. CCH was able to provide the funds to purchase a small air conditioner to help Hatley breath easier.

Robert was facing disconnection of his AEP electric service. His wife was on a breathing machine due to lung condition. The utility company had already offered all the assistance that was available. CCH was able to make a payment to help keep the power on.

Imagine what it would be like to have just changed your baby and using the very last diaper, or having no toilet tissue and stealing from a public facility.....not very pleasant thoughts. Many of the clients Christian Clearing House (CCH) help face these dilemmas daily. We see clients that have not bathed in days or children elated to receive a toothbrush because they have to share with a sibling. As unfortunate as it sounds, it is the reality that comes to life daily within the CCH office.

The cupboard donations started a few years back when a Boy Scout needing a project decided to solicit his church congregation for donations to make hygiene kits for individuals/families needing such items. In 2017, the cupboard had grown to an estimated dollar value on the items received and distributed of more than \$21,000. The cupboard often works in mysterious ways. Often the staff will look at the shelves and comment on how bare they have become, then someone will knock on the door or call stating that they have a donation of taxable items they would like to drop off.

CCH has a budget fund to purchase items when the shelves are empty, which typically is used to replenish laundry soap and toilet tissue. Many church congregations and business set up donation boxes during the holiday season to collect items for CCH. All donations are greatly appreciated and distributed directly to those with needs here in our community.

Summer is the time of the year the CCH office is the busiest. We believe the reason for the increase in assistance comes this time of the year because school is out, children are now eating additional meals at home and working parents need to pay for child care. Also, other assistance programs for utilities are inactive. At CCH, we see the families that are living on the edge that fall behind for many different reasons.

Stuff the Bus/ Project Happy Feet

Stuff the Bus will take place on July 19—21 at McDonald's on Tiffin Ave. This community collaboration with Christian Clearing House, WFIN/WKXA, The Fox, The Findlay Publishing Company, McDonalds, The Family Center, and Stonebridge Church, distributed over 900 backpacks filled with school supplies to area children in 2017. The needs are always greater. However the supplies/cash

donations that are collected at the bus is just the start —if your church or business would like to set up a collection box for supplies to help, donations can be dropped off at Stone Bridge Church on or before August 1th. Backpacks are always the largest need. The backpacks filled with supplies will be distributed prior to the start of school. Any remaining supplies are taken directly to the schools. We are requesting all donations be new.

If you know of a family in need of receiving school supplies and shoes, registration is required.

Applications to register will be available beginning

July 16, 2018 at The Family Center.

Not only does CCH work to coordinate the school supply distribution, we also work to raise enough funds for a program called Project Happy Feet. Through a voucher program, local children are able to receive a new pair of back to schools shoes. Without this program area children would not have suitable shoes to start the school year. For the past three years, over 1,500 children have received a voucher to go to the shoe store for a new pair of shoes.

The voucher is valued at \$50 and good for one pair of shoes. Any unused dollars come back to CCH to help provide shoes for additional children. 100% of dollars raised for Project Happy Feet go directly to help area children. Additional dollars are needed to continue the program.
